



## Glossary

<b>Agency</b>	A business or organization established to provide a particular service
<b>Avalanche</b>	a mass of snow, ice, and rocks falling rapidly down a mountainside
<b>Capitalize</b>	take the chance to gain advantage from
<b>Citizen</b>	a person who legally belongs to a country and has the rights and protection of that country
<b>Conservation</b>	the careful utilization of a resource in order to prevent waste and leave some for future generations
<b>Conserve</b>	careful utilization of a resource to maintain resource from harm, destruction, or waste (especially an environmentally or culturally important place or thing)
<b>Culture</b>	a way of thinking, behaving, or working that exists in a place or organization
<b>Economy</b>	financial system of interaction and exchange
<b>Entrust</b>	to give somebody the responsibility of doing something or of caring for someone or something
<b>Erosion</b>	When soil is picked up and moved to another place by ice, water, wind, or gravity
<b>Landform</b>	A natural feature of the earth's surface
<b>Manage</b>	be in charge of, run, be head of, head, direct, control, preside over, lead, govern, rule, command, supervise, oversee, administer, organize, conduct, handle, guide

<b>Monument</b>	a building, structure, or site that is of historical importance or interest
<b>Opportunity</b>	a set of circumstances that makes it possible to do something
<b>Preserve</b>	maintain something in its original or existing state
<b>Private land</b>	land owned by a person or group and kept for their exclusive use; permission and access for any purpose must be granted by the owner
<b>Public land</b>	land owned by a government; may or may not be accessible to the public
<b>Recreation</b>	an activity that is undertaken for pleasure or relaxation
<b>Revenue</b>	money that is made by or paid to a business or an organization
<b>Rock Slide</b>	when rocks, boulders, and earth slide or fall down a hill or mountain
<b>State parks</b>	state lands reserved to be enjoyed by the public for recreation and tourism and do not generate income through development
<b>State Trust Lands</b>	lands that were granted to Wyoming and designated to generate revenue for public schools and other state institutions
<b>Steward</b>	an individual who manages areas or resources
<b>Stewardship</b>	As Wyoming citizens, we are stewards entrusted with the responsible development, care, and use of our resources to benefit current and future generations.
<b>Tourism</b>	the activity of traveling to a place for pleasure that can generate revenue from the enjoyment of Wyoming's land and/or resources
<b>Weathering</b>	Gradual wearing-away of rocks from weather; first stage in erosion
<b>Wildfire</b>	A fire in a wild area that is not controlled and that can burn a large area very quickly
