




## **CELEBRATING STUDENT ACCOMPLISHMENT**

## REGIONAL WORKSHOPS CONNECT EDUCATORS WITH THE WYOMING STEWARDSHIP PROJECT

Wyoming Agriculture in the Classroom hosted educator workshops in three Wyoming communities this summer. Educators in and around Rawlins, Casper, and Sheridan had the opportunity to dig deep into lessons from the Wyoming Stewardship Project during each of these two-day sessions. Educators learned how the content from units develops along a storyline and discovered the hands-on, standards aligned science and social studies content contained within the lessons. Field trips to local sites provided examples for how to tie lessons back to local communities and strengthen students' ties to their community and state.
